This Special Meeting of the City's Refuse Collection and Disposal Rate Board ("Rate Board") is to hear and consider objections to the May 8, 2012, Hearing Officer's Report and Recommended Order on the Department of Public Works' 2012 Refuse Rate Application for a change in the allocation of certain funds.

On March 29, 2012, the Department of Public Works (DPW) filed an Application with the Chair of the Rate Board requesting continuation of a previously approved change in the allocation of certain funds derived from a surcharge on residential refuse collection and disposal rates, from a Special Reserve Account that is held under the Facilitation Agreement between the City and Recology San Francisco to the portion of the Impound Account that is dedicated to DPW for recycling and waste management. Because the Application was filed by DPW, the Chair appointed an independent Hearing Officer to conduct the hearing and prepare the report and recommended order otherwise required of the Director of Public Works under the 1932 Refuse Collection and Disposal Initiative Ordinance (1932 Ordinance). Pursuant to DPW Order No. 180,016 (Rules of Procedure, Refuse Collection and Disposal Rate Hearings), a hearing was held on April 25, 2012, and the Hearing Officer's Report and Recommended Order was issued May 8, 2012.

Written objections to the Hearing Officer's Report and Recommended Order were received from one source by Rate Board Chair Kelly before the statutory deadline on May 25, 2012; these objections are now scheduled for hearing before the Rate Board on June 14, 2012, commencing at 3:00 p.m., City Hall Room 305, San Francisco, CA 94102. (See Agenda Item III, 1 through 4, below, which include a summary of the objections; these descriptions are for general information only and are not intended to represent any decision, fact or position of the City or the Rate Board.) No additional objections may be raised or filed, orally or in writing. Objectors and Non-Objectors may only rely upon evidence previously placed in the administrative record during the April 25, 2012, hearing through testimony or documents; they may not present new evidence at the Rate Board hearing. After hearing presentations on the objections and responses from the Hearing Officer and others, the Rate Board will take action to approve or deny the 2012 Refuse Rate Application in whole or in part.

Accessible MUNI lines serving this location are the #5 Fulton/McAllister, #19 Polk, #21 Hayes, #47 Van Ness, #49 Van Ness/Mission, #71 Haight/Noriega, the F-line to Market and Van Ness, and the MUNI Metro stations at Van Ness and Market and Civic Center. The closest BART station serving City Hall is the Civic Center station. The closest MUNI Metro stations are at Van Ness & Market and Civic Center.
